**REVISED MAINTENANCE FORM:** The Maintenance Request Form has been revised to include a tear-off section that will be returned to the homeowner upon completion of the work requested. This should eliminate the repeated requests even after the work has been done. A copy of the new form is included in this mailing. Additional copies will be available in the envelope by the bulletin board on Hidden Ridge Drive. Please be reminded that all maintenance requests should be in writing and please use a separate forms for each item requested.

NEWLY ADOPTED POLICIES: The Board of Directors has recently adopted and are enforcing two new policies. The first one is regarding the placement of Satellite Dishes on the exterior and roofs of our units, and the other is a set of guidelines for the construction of sheds. HIDDEN RIDGE DIRECTORY CORRECTIONS AND/OR ADDITIONS: A page of corrections/additions to the latest directory has been included in this publication for you to attach to the directory that you received last month. A new directory will be printed in the summer of 2018. Anyone who needs a directory should contact me.

UPDATED INFORMATION NEEDED: Updated information is needed on all residents. All information will be kept confidential. Please complete the Hidden Ridge Information Sheet that is enclosed in this mailing and return it in the enclosed envelope by October 7, 2017.

TAX GRIEVANCE: I have been notified by the lawyer who represented our residents that the last batch of checks was recently mailed to the remaining 19 homeowners filed through his office. Anyone who has not received their check should contact me ASAP. I have also learned that anyone who never filed a grievance with our group should contact the tax assessor for the Town of Thompson and inquire about having the assessed value of their unit reduced.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, we hope that you had an enjoyable summer. Our wish for everyone in the coming year is health and prosperity. May we all return next year for an even better year at our Jewel of the Catskills.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE BOARD

Please be advised that the manner in which the Board of Directors will be dealing with members who are in arrears has been modified. The following policy is in effect August 12, 2017:

1. Any member who has not paid the monthly HOA fee within 30 days of the due date (the first of every month) will receive a letter from the HOA bookkeeper advising them of their failure to pay the HOA fee when due and advising the member the member now owes the specific month's fee plus the \$25 late fee.

2. Any member who is more than two (2) months delinquent in payment of the HOA fee will receive a letter from the Board advising them of their failure to pay the HOA fee and advising them that they will be suspended as a member if the fee is not paid and the consequences of suspension.

3. The name of member who is more than three (3) months delinquent in payment of the HOA fee will be presented to the Board for action on suspension. If the Board votes to suspend, the member will receive a letter advising the member that they have been suspended and the consequences of the suspension.

4. Any member who is more than four (4) months delinquent in payment of HOA fees will be referred to the HOA attorney for immediate legal action.



#### Keep Your Brain "Happy" Habits to Boost Your Memory

Do not expose yourself to NEGATIVE STEREOTYPES about growing older. We are all going in same direction!!!! **\*\*EXERCISE MUST BECOME A DAILY HAB-**IT: WALKING, STROLLING - MOVE AS MUCH AS YOU CAN EACH DAY. Research shows that in addition to your favorite sport, such as, biking, dancing, golfing, swimming, playing tennis, doing yoga, etc., that those seniors who got daily exercise light or moderate exercise through walks or strolls showed least memory loss. So, please do a FAMILY or SO-CIALIZING walk (talk, laugh, debate) OR do a NA-TURE STROLL in Hidden Ridge (forest and woodsy walks). These benefit heart and lung functions more than city walking or do a MEDITATION WALK and use the time alone to think or philosophize. Again research shows older adults who walk 6-9 miles a week LOWERED THEIR RISK OF MEMORY PROB-LEMS BY 50%

**\*\*DO WHAT YOU LOVE:** A hobby or talent or craft that keeps you thinking, creating and following directions such as, quilting, crosswords, sudukos, Scrabble, card games, chess, knitting, painting, etc. keep you happy, content and productive.

#### **INN IN THE INN**

We'd been stationed at Ft. Lee, Va. for two weeks before they gave us a 48-hour pass. The army pay was only \$50 a month, so we had to be a little frugal and careful how we spent our money. We decided to visit Washington D.C.

A latrine rumor had it that the Presbyterian Home for Soldiers only charged \$5 per day. The building was a 4 story walk up and each floor was about the size of a basketball court with cots lined up in military order.

The Home served coffee, donuts and orange juice all day long and cold cereal for breakfast. One of the soldiers asked us what time we would attend services. We told him we hadn't yet made up our minds.

When we descended the stairs, feeling a little uncomfortable and guilty, we stopped on the second floor to listen to about a dozen soldiers singing.

To this very day, I believe that their rendition of Zoom Golly Golly was the best that I ever heard.

Since six of us wanted to go back to Washington, I called the Ambassador Hotel to make reservations. A suite was only \$12. We sneaked into the room so that the hotel wouldn't know how many of us were going to sleep there. We couldn't afford extra charges.

When entering the suite, there was a kitchen on the right with a small stove, refrigerator and a bar. The living room had a hanging chandelier, a couch, a sofa, assorted chairs and a table and chairs. The bedroom had a double bed and a stuffed lounge chair.

We chose up to see who sleeps where. Two slept on the bed, one on the couch, one on the sofa, one on the lounge chair and one used two of the fancy chairs.

When we signed out. I paid the clerk with 12 one dollar bills. The clerk seeing that I was in uniform said "When you registered you should have mentioned that you were in the army. We would have only charged you \$5 for the suite."

#### **IMPORTANT REMINDER TO MEMBERS** WORK ON THE EXTERIOR OF YOUR UNIT By Fred Hirsh

Over the past several months, members have performed or commenced work on the exterior of their unit that required Board approval without obtaining approval from the Board.

Any changes or modifications you are planning to make to the exterior of your unit probably needs approval of the Board. Before you do any work on the exterior of your unit such as painting a door, changing the windows or doors or basement doors, replacing a storm door, constructing a deck, patio or shed, and/or affixing anything on the exterior of the unit that requires that you place screws or nails through the roof or siding, please consult with the Board to determine if you need Board approval before the work commences. ALL REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRITING.

#### WATER AT HIDDEN RIDGE By Robbie Schecter

As many of you know, we discovered in 2009 that we had serious issues with the quality of our water. Several of us formed a Safe Water Committee. With the assistance of our local DOH, our water supply company, Crystal Water Supply, was forced to close the well and associated gravity pull from Anawana Lake, and implement a new well to supply our water.

As time went by I began to worry about our water quality, assuming that it had not been tested since 2010. I went to our local DOH and learned that our water is tested by an independent lab, monthly for some contaminants, and annually for others. However, we at Hidden Ridge, the consumers of the water, did not receive any of the testing results. All results were sent to our water supplier.

On June 16, 2017, with the assistance of our local DOH engineer, Glen Illing, I submitted a FOIL (Freedom of Information Law) request to the Albany DOH. Finally, on August 14, 2017, I received via email from the Records access officer that my request had been granted. Attached to the email were 20 pages of independent lab water quality reports from 9/16/2014 thru 4/20/2017. Hidden Ridge will also access future test be able to results.

Additionally, during one of many visits to the DOH, I saw a flier for free lead testing for homes in NYS built before 1985. I submitted the necessary paperwork, and beginning in 2018 our water will be tested periodically for lead in addition to the other possible contaminants. YAY!!! Sometimes patience and perseverance pay off!






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
