Dear Hidden Ridgers,

Welcome back! It is great to be back, although I am not thrilled about the cold temperatures, rain and wind. Oh well, - it will be warmer soon enough (I hope).

The Jewel of the Catskills is shining due to the efforts of our year round maintenance program. After cleaning up well into April from the March blizzard, the crew started to get the community ready for the summer season. You can see the following as you go through the community:

- A portion of the pool deck has been replaced both on the top surface as well as underneath to the concrete footings.
- Several tree stumps from trees that were cut down due to the fact they were diseased or deemed as a safety hazard have been removed and the areas rejuvenated with fresh top soil and grass seed. Some of the grass is already growing. Efforts will be made in the future to buy and plant new trees.
- Cleaning up of debris in front and behind the units is almost complete.
- At least five retaining walls have been replaced.
- Cedar shingles on the front of several units have been replaced.
- Mowing and weed whacking of the quickly growing grass is ongoing.
- Getting the pool and clubhouse ready was a high priority in May. The pool and clubhouse are ready for all of us to enjoy.
- The cleaning of the gutters and power washing of the units will be our next priority. We ask that you leave your outside water on so that the maintenance crew can complete the power washing.
- The roads have been swept by a professional sweeping company to rid us of most of the residue left by the sand/ salt that were used to treat the roads during the winter storms.

The community owes a great deal of gratitude to Lenny Kirschenbaum who handled every situation this winter no matter how large with finesse. He deserves a well needed vacation! Thanks also to Ben Lorick and Robbie Schecter who assisted Lenny with the signing of checks to pay our bills.

Those homeowners who participated in the tax grievance should be receiving their refunds momentarily. Look for it in your mail.

On behalf of the Board of Directors I would like to welcome the new homeowners and new renters who will be sharing their first summer with us. We hope that all of our residents will join us at our "Kick off to Summer Pool Party" on July 1 and our BBQ and Show on July 2.







DOG REGISTRATION

The following rules concerning dogs have been accepted into our documents. All residents (owners and renters) are to adhere to the following:



- Homeowners and renters are to register their dogs (including service dogs as well as those visiting for a short time) with the homeowners association and provide proof of current rabies vaccination. Please send this information to the office.
- All dogs residing in Hidden Ridge for a period of 30 consecutive days must also be registered and licensed in the Town of Thompson. Proof of this license must be presented to the homeowners association. All homeowners shall provide proof the dog is licensed in the jurisdiction in which the dog's primary residence is maintained, if the dog does not reside for a period of 30 consecutive days in Hidden Ridge.
- Dog owners are responsible for abiding by the regulations set forth by the Town of Thompson which includes picking up after their dog, walking dogs on leashes, avoiding excessive barking, etc.
- There is a limit of 2 dogs per unit. If you have more than two dogs you MAY NOT replace the extra dog(s) as you lose them.




