

The President's Message

Dear Hidden Ridgers,



Monthly Maintenance Fees: At the present time the Monthly Maintenance fees for January 1- June 30, 2018 will remain at \$325 per month. Should there be a need to change this amount; based upon an approved budget for May 1, 2018- April 30, 2019, you will be notified in June 2018. You are reminded that the fee is due on the 1st of the month and any remittance with a postmark later than the 10th of the month will be considered late and a late fee will be assessed to your account. Those who are in arrears for more than 30 days will receive letters indicating that certain services may be suspended if payments are not current. Other actions will be instituted for those who are in arrears three months or more.

Voucher Booklets: Payment Vouchers and mailing labels for January -June 2018 are included in this mailing (except for those homeowners who opted out due to automatic payments from their banks). Another set of vouchers will be distributed in June 2018 based upon our approved budget.

Winter Maintenance. Our crew has been working very hard to accommodate the increasing number of full time residents and the maintenance of our property. They are addressing all maintenance needs - cleaning and repairing gutters, removing brush and leaves from the grounds, repairing storm drains, replacing cedar shingles in the front of units and making Hidden Ridge ready for spring. If you have a maintenance issue, please complete a maintenance request form and place it in the maintenance mailbox attached to the bulletin board. We ask for your patience and cooperation. If you have any serious concerns that cannot be addressed in this manner, contact Lenny Kirschenbaum, our Property Manager.

Snow removal: Our crew, with our two trucks with snow plows is able to handle all of our snow removal needs. Please be reminded that the sequence of the plowing is as follows: main roads, cul de sacs and then walkways. The crew has a list of those homeowners who need to get to work and will try to prioritize their work accordingly. Please be patient. If there is a significant amount of snow accumulation on your roof, they will remove it as well. If you have any specific issues or questions or if you are coming up to Hidden Ridge for a weekend and want to make sure that your walkway is cleared, contact Lenny Kirschenbaum at 845-794-3395.







Rentals at Hidden Ridge - Updated Rules

The following are the rental rules for Hidden Ridge. We are printing them again to remind those homeowners who are renting their units this year.

Rental Rules:

1. The homes in our community are to be used for residential purposes only. The Board defines "residential purposes" as including the following:

A home may be deemed to be used for "residential purposes" if said home, or a portion of said home, is leased to one (1) individual or a group of individuals for any period of time up to a maximum of twelve (12) months over a period of eighteen (18) months. The leasing of a home, or portion of a home, for any portion of a given month during the twelve (12) month period referenced herein, shall be deemed leasing for an entire month for the purposes of calculating the aforesaid eighteen (18) month period. All leases will be for one year and non–renewable.

- 2. The rental fee for a twelve (12) month period will be \$1200.
- 3. The rental fee for a summer rental (May October) will be \$500.
- 4. Homeowners who rent their units are to provide to the Homeowners Association a copy of the lease along with the appropriate fees. The lease and the fee are to be sent to the office at least 30 days prior to the occupancy of the tenants. A late fee of \$250 will be assessed to the owner if the rental fee is not paid two weeks prior to occupancy. The homeowner is to complete and submit the rental form along with the lease and appropriate fee.
- 5. In order for the tenant to be able to use the facilities and participate in any HOA activities, all maintenance fees must be current.
- 6. Unit owners are required to hand the keys to the unit and mailbox as well as the *Revised A-Z Booklet* to the renter
- 7. Units are rented "as is." It is the owner's obligation, not the Homeowners Association to repair and maintain the inside of the unit.

IMPORTANT REMINDER TO MEMBERS WORK ON THE EXTERIOR OF YOUR UNIT

Over the past several months, members have performed or commenced work on the exterior of their unit that required Board approval without obtaining approval from the Board.

Any changes or modifications you are planning to make to the exterior of your unit probably needs approval of the Board. Before you do any work on the exterior of your unit such as painting a door, changing the windows or doors or basement doors, replacing a storm door, constructing a deck, patio or shed, and/or affixing anything on the exterior of the unit that requires that you place screws or nails through the roof or siding, please consult with the Board to determine if you need Board approval before the work commences. ALL REQUESTS MUST BE IN WRIT-ING.

WATER AT HIDDEN RIDGE LEAD IN WATER

I recently participated in the Free Water Testing Pilot Program offered by the New York State Dept. of Health.

Two samples of my kitchen tap water were analyzed. The "first draw" sample (water collected from my kitchen faucet following an 8 hour period of non use) FAILED New York State guidelines for lead in drinking water. The "flush sample" (collected after letting later run for at least 30 seconds) was within acceptable limits.

The following were among recommendations that accompanied the report:

- 1. Do not cook with, or drink, water from the hot water tap. Lead dissolves more easily into hot water.
- 2. Do not boil water to remove lead. Boiling water will not reduce the lead.

FINAL TAX GRIEVANCE REPORT

Owners of 106 units in Hidden Ridge joined together to challenge the real property assessment on their homes. As a result of this proceeding, the assessment of all the these owners units was reduced to \$48,400 for real estate tax pur-

The owners of the units that did not challenge their assessment have also had their assessment reduced by the Assessor of the Town of Thompson to \$48,400.

All Monticello Central School District, Town of Thompson and Sullivan County real property taxes for all unit owners will now be calculated based upon an assessed value of \$48,400 starting with the Monticello Central School District real property taxes that were due and payable in September 2017. Based upon the current assessment, all homeowners in Hidden Ridge should have paid school taxes of \$1013. Full-time residents who have a STAR Exemption or Enhanced STAR Exemption paid less.

Fred Hirsh has spoken to the assessor. There is little likelihood of a town-wide reassessment in the foreseeable future. The local municipalities are waiting to see how the opening of the casino, the Veria Health Spa and their related facilities affect their revenue and expenses before deciding on whether to conduct a town-wide reassessment.

Thanks to Warren Berkowitz for all the work he did to obtain the assessment reduction.

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


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
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
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
