The transfer fee on the sale of a unit has been increased to \$2500 on all transfers that take place pursuant to contracts of sale entered into on or after September 15, 2020. The transfer fee is paid by the buyer at the time of closing.

Grandpa's Secret

Grandpa Meyers was born in Austria on his grandfather's farm in 1866. Because the farm also bred horses, he became an outstanding horseman. When he was drafted into the Austro-Hungarian Army, he was one of the few Jews allowed in the Calvary. Needless to say it was a harrowing experience for him.

When my Grandma gave birth to their first son, my father, in 1898, my Grandpa decided to emigrate to America so that his sons would never have to serve in the military. Grandpa would not even allow my father or my brother or me to join the Boy Scouts because they wore a uniform.

My dad was born in 1898 and was too young to serve in The Great War and too old to be drafted in World War II. He did not tell his parents that my brother, Marvin, was drafted or wounded in the war until he came back from Europe in 1945 with numerous medals on his chest. When my grandparents saw him, my Grandma hugged him tight and my Grandfather pressed his finger on Marvin's purple heart and started to cry.

My grandparents lived on the Lower East Side at 80 Columbia Street. Every Friday after class at NYU, I would take the subway a couple of stops to visit them. My Grandma always offered me food which I always refused, and she always called my Dad to complain.

All four of my grandparents never spoke to me in any language other than English. Yiddish was spoken only when they did not want me or my brother to understand what they were saying.

One weekend in 1953, a few months before my graduation from college, and before I was drafted in the Army, my grandfather motioned to me and told me to follow him. Grandpa took me to a back room in his buttonhole store downstairs to tell me the family secrets. He made me promise that I would never tell the secrets to anyone.

"Ally, the family secrets are only between you and me."

He then dropped his voice to make sure no one on the other side of the door could hear and whispered in my ear the family secrets... in Yiddish.

"Grandpa I don't understand Yiddish"

"I forgessin, I'll tell you in English"

Three times he tried to tell me, and three times he said it in Yiddish. But at that point Grandma came in and made him leave. My dad asked him what he said, and with a glint in his eye, told him that it was "... only between me and Ally..."

Planning Ahead to Avoid Weight Gain During Holiday/Winter Season

With holiday season and eating already underway, especially after Thanksgiving, we must all be mindful and careful of not sabotaging healthy eating. This commitment becomes even more important because unless you are a dedicated daily "work outer," most people tend to stay indoors eliminating the natural way we exercise in the warm weather (lots to of walking, swimming, golfing, biking, etc). Unless you are lucky to be in Fla., we New Yorkers (and others) must hit the gym hard in order to burn the extra calories these months tend to pack on. So plan ahead with these tips and hopefully they will help you to control your will power, so you remain in your optimum health and fitness level(without getting stressed and angry at yourself that you "let yourself go").

- 1. Write out your food challenges for the week..birthday, Chanukah latkes, Christmas dinner, New Years Party, tons of hors d'oeuvres, extra high calorie drinks and then write out a Food Plan sticking to portion control and picking one or two favorites (not tasting everything!).
- 2. Plan your meals when you eat at home, to be nutritious and have fewer calories to help balance the more fattening meals you know you will have when you are eating out.
- 3. When you go shopping be sure you make a list of healthy lo cal snacks and lots of fruits and veggies.

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
